RESOLUTION NO. 065-2018**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOVERDALE AWARDING A CONTRACT BID TO WINNER CHEVROLET/ELK GROVE AUTO GROUP NOT TO EXCEED FOURTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$40,000) FOR THE PURCHASE OF A 2019 CHEVROLET TAHOE POLICE VEHICLE AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER, OR HIS DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE SAID AGREEMENT; AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF SONOMA FLEET OPERATIONS DIVISION TO OUTFIT SAID VEHICLE WITH THE ASSOCIATED EQUIPMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED TWENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000)

WHEREAS, the Cloverdale Police Department currently has fourteen (14) vehicles in service, including one (1) patrol vehicle dedicated as a K9 service vehicle; and

WHEREAS, of the fourteen (14) vehicles, several are reaching the end of their duty cycle due to age and high mileage; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of a new vehicle will supplement and upgrade our fleet of marked patrol vehicles, allow for more pro-active visibility, increase officer safety, and alleviate budgetary impacts due to vehicle maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department utilized the State of California Bid for the purchase of this vehicle; and

WHEREAS, Winner Chevrolet/Elk Grove Auto Group was the lowest responsible bidder selected by the State of California and had the lowest quote of THIRTY-NINE THOUSAND TWO DOLLARS AND 37/100 (\$39,002.37); and

WHEREAS, the City currently contracts with the County of Sonoma's Fleet Operations for installation of patrol vehicle equipment and parts and it is estimated that the cost for essential equipment and parts installation, including labor, will not exceed TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000); and

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOVERDALE FINDS AND RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
2. The Contract for the purchase of one 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe police package vehicle shall be awarded to the Winner Chevrolet/Elk Grove Auto Group.
3. The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to purchase one 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe police package vehicle in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.
4. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute an agreement with the County of Sonoma Fleet Operations Division to outfit said vehicle with the associated equipment, in an amount not to exceed \$25,000



Agenda Item Title

Consideration and adoption of Resolution No. 065-2018, awarding a contract bid to Winner Chevrolet/Elk Grove Auto Group in the amount not to exceed \$40,000 for the purchase of one 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe police vehicle and authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute said agreement; Authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute an agreement with the County of Sonoma Fleet Operations Division as provided for in the *Master Intergovernmental Service Agreement* dated May 28, 2015 to outfit said vehicle with the necessary equipment in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.

Summary

The 2018-19 approved City budget reflects the purchase of a new police vehicle, a Chevrolet Tahoe to replace a 2003 Ford Crown Victoria that currently has 110,000 miles and serves as a primary patrol vehicle. The City takes the opportunity to piggy back on the State of California’s bidding process for the vehicle, which alleviates the need for a formal bid process and affords us the best price due to the volume of vehicles being purchased throughout the State.

The police department utilizes a personal vehicle program whereby each officer is assigned a vehicle. This program has been in existence for the past two decades and provides benefits to the community that include a perception from the residents of an increased police presence by having the vehicles parked at the officer’s home while off duty. This program was last visited during the May 15, 2018 City Council Budget Workshop. Currently, the Cloverdale Police Department has fourteen (14) vehicles in service, including one (1) patrol vehicle dedicated as a K9 service vehicle.

The City entered into an agreement with the County of Sonoma Fleets Operations Division on May 28, 2015 for the installation of patrol vehicle equipment, parts and other repair services. As part of this agreement the county provides outfitting services of new vehicles to a number of local agencies, including Cloverdale. Our experience to date is that we have found their work to be outstanding. Each vehicle is set up just like the previous vehicle, which aids in the ability to diagnose problems and repair vehicles efficiently. The estimated cost to outfit the 2019 Tahoe both parts and labor will not exceed \$25,000.

Options

(1) Adopt the attached Resolution awarding the bid for the purchase of a police vehicle to Winner Chevrolet/Elk Grove Auto Group and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to purchase one 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe police package vehicle in an amount not to exceed \$40,000; Authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute an agreement with the County of Sonoma Fleet Operations Division to outfit the new vehicle at a cost not to exceed \$25,000; or

(2) Reject the attached Resolution and decline to authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to purchase one 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe police package vehicle, and associated necessary outfitting labor and equipment costs.

Budget/Financial Impact

Total cost of the requested vehicle and outfitting shall not to exceed the currently budget amount of \$65,000.
