RESOLUTION NO. 016 –2019**

**Emergency Resolution Under Government Code
Section 54954.2(B)(2) Ratifying An Emergency Proclamation
issued by the Director of Emergency Services**

WHEREAS, an extreme storm event known as an atmospheric river occurred in the City of Cloverdale during the period from February 25-27, 2019, that resulted in flooding of local streets (Railroad Avenue, E. 3rd Street) and facilities (Water Treatment Plant, Wastewater Treatment Plant and River Park Trail) and generated numerous landslides and erosion that generated significant amount of debris and soil that inundated private and public property within the City of Cloverdale, and

WHEREAS, the impacts of the February 2019 storm events are currently being evaluated and are expected to result in an unknown and significant amount of city expenses to cover the additional staff time, consultant work, equipment and materials as well as contractor costs to address and rectify the flooding and landslides both temporarily and long term; and

WHEREAS, with storms projected to continue through the coming weeks and months, there is a strong likelihood that additional flooding and land sliding in the area of the initial slides and flooding could occur which could cause further damage to public and private property, and further impact residents in the area; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services issued a Proclamation declaring an emergency, pursuant to Cloverdale Municipal Code section 2.44.060 as a result of the landslide; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has now been asked to ratify that Proclamation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds, based on the facts set forth above and the facts presented to it at the City Council Meeting of February 27, 2019, that the circumstances described do constitute an emergency pursuant to Cloverdale Municipal Code section 2.44.020.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Cloverdale hereby ratifies the Emergency Proclamation issued by the Director of Emergency Services on February 27, 2019.

Proclamation of Local Emergency by Director of Emergency Services for the City of Cloverdale

WHEREAS, Section 2.44.060 of the Cloverdale Municipal Code empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the City Council is not in session and the City is affected or likely to be affected by an emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cloverdale is not in session; and:

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services of the City of Cloverdale does hereby find:

1. That conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within the City, caused by the "February 2019 atmospheric river rain events and subsequent flooding" which began at approximately 06:00 a.m. on the 25th day of February and persisted through February 27, 2017, and;
2. That these conditions are, or are likely to be, beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City of Cloverdale; and
3. That the City Council of the City of Cloverdale is not in session and cannot immediately be called into session.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a local emergency now exists throughout the City of Cloverdale; and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said local emergency the powers, functions, and duties of the emergency organization of this city shall be those prescribed by state law, by ordinances, and resolutions of this City, and by the City of Cloverdale Emergency Operations Plan, as approved by the City Council pursuant to Ordinance No. 385-83 § 12 (part), 1983; Ord. 339 N.S. § 2, 1975; Ord. 292 N.S. § 6, 1975.

That this emergency proclamation shall expire in 7 days after issuance unless confirmed and ratified by the governing body of the City of Cloverdale.
