 Mayor's Report – June 10, 2021

Council Updates of Note

- On April 5th, City Council adopted a Resolution in solidarity with the Asian American Pacific Islander Communities denouncing anti-Asian racism, discrimination, intimidations, threats and violence.
- Petaluma joined the water conservation cause in April came in 8th place nationally (in its population category) in the Wylan National Mayor's Challenge for Water Conservation. We are proud of the dedication of our citizens! It's never too late to "Take the Pledge!" and reduce water usage: www.mywaterpledge.com.
- Petaluma City Council unanimously approved implementing a mobile crisis response pilot program modeled after the CAHOOTS model with Petaluma People Services Center (PPSC) on May 3rd. PPSC was determined to be the best organization to implement this new pilot program due to the social services programs they currently provided to the community. This mobile crisis response model program will address whole-person care in the community and will deploy civilian crisis and para-clinician resources to situations historically only handled by the Police and Fire Departments.
- On May 17th, the City Council held a workshop to learn about the current state of affordable housing in Petaluma and discussed options for increasing housing affordability moving forward. The workshop discussed State requirements for affordable housing, shared best practices from other jurisdictions that have successfully increased affordable housing options, and discussed available funding for local affordable housing development. Finally, staff presented current policy trends that the City can consider and options for engaging the community in decision-making about affordable housing policies.
