RESOLUTION NO. 050-2022

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOVERDALE ADOPTING A LIST OF
PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022/2023 FUNDED BY SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND
ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017**

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, the City has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/the project list; and

WHEREAS, the City used Public comments, Councilmember input and a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet community priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS the funding from SB 1 will help the City maintain and rehabilitate West Fourth Street from Jefferson Street to the street end this year and maintain and rehabilitate Clark Avenue from South Street to Blair Street next year; and

WHEREAS, the 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City's streets and roads are in an "at-risk" condition and this revenue will help us prevent further degradation of the overall quality of our road system over the next decade; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety and investing in complete streets infrastructure which will contribute positive co-benefits to the citizens of Cloverdale and statewide; and

WHEREAS, the City, will receive an estimated \$180,000 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2022-23 from SB 1; and.

WHEREAS, this is the 3rd year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding that will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide and citywide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND by the City Council of the City of Cloverdale, State of California as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
2. The following previously proposed and adopted project, and proposed new project, will utilize fiscal year 2022-23 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues in their delivery. With the relisting of the previously proposed project and addition of the new project in the adopted fiscal year resolution, the City is affirming to the public and the State our intent to fund these projects with Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:
 - a. The previously proposed and adopted **West Fourth Street Rehabilitation Project** from Jefferson Street to street end. West Fourth Street will be rehabilitated from Jefferson Street to the street end. This project is expected to have a functional life of about 30 years once complete. Project was delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic and is now expected to be complete by late spring 2022.
 - b. The proposed **Clark Avenue Rehabilitation Project** from South Street to Blair Street. Clark Avenue will be reconstructed and/or overlain as needed to restore the surface. This project is expected to have a functional life of 30 years once complete. Project is expected to be complete by the summer of 2024.


